Awarded the 'Sahitya Academy Award' in 1986 for her book 'Vichhor', she was most recently conferred with prestigious “Lifetime Achievement Award” for her outstanding contribution in the field of Sindhi Literature, Arts and Culture by Sindhi Academy, Delhi.

Sundri's gentle and soothing nature moved many hearts. She was known to have inspired and brought together many creative thinkers across the globe to contribute extensively to the rich and vibrant Sindhi cultural landscape. On her demise, she leaves behind a strong and compelling body of work that will be read and revered by future generations.
